A B.F.Sc. 2020 batch student, Mr. Agam Kumar, bearing Roll No. COF/24/2020, currently registered in the 10<sup>th</sup> semester on 01.07.2025 of the academic year 2024-25. The student has requested to be allowed to register in the failed/repeat course (FRM-311, "Marine Fisheries", 1+0) of the odd semester (5<sup>th</sup> Semester) during the ongoing 10<sup>th</sup> even semester instead of waiting for the 11<sup>th</sup> semester. Status of the course load of the student is given below-

The 7<sup>th</sup> Board of Studies of College of Fisheries, Kishanganj recommended that Mr. Agam Kumar may be allowed to register for the failed course (FRM-311, "Marine Fisheries", 1+0) of the odd semester (5<sup>th</sup> Semester) during the ongoing 10<sup>th</sup> even semester instead of waiting for the 11<sup>th</sup> semester. As offering one credit from the odd semester does not exceed the permitted credit load (i.e. 28 credit hours).

The Dean, COF, Kishanganj vide its letter No. 146/COF/Kishanganj/2025-26 dated 01.08.2025 submitted proposal to grant permission for the same in view of academic progression and completion of degree requirement on time.

Considering the recommendation of 7<sup>th</sup> BOS of COF, Kishaganj as well as proposal of the Dean, COF, Kishanganj, Mr. Agam Kumar was permitted to register the non-running repeat/failed course (FRM-311, "Marine Fisheries", 1+0) during the ongoing 10<sup>th</sup> semester in anticipation of approval from the Academic Council vide O.O. No. BASU/Reg./Acad./F.No.-78/220 dated 07.08.2025.

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal for post-facto approval.

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09/AC-23/25 Post-facto approval for amendment in clause 19 (12) of RRI for conduct of practical-cum-viva-voce external examination of B.V.Sc. & A.H. Programme duly notified vide O.O. No.- BASU/Reg./Exam./F.No. 195/239 dated 26.08.2025.

The present provision for conducting practical-cum-viva-voce examination of B.V.Sc. & A.H. Programme as prescribed in clause 19 (12) of RRI for B.V.Sc. & A.H. Programme states that "The annual/final practical examinations shall be conducted by a Board of Examiners consisting of an external examiner appointed by the COE, concerned Head of the Department, teacher and a representative of the Dean."

As per the above provision, there is provision of the external examiner to be appointed by the COE, BASU, Patna. In this connection, it is relevant to mention here that sometimes due to non-consent of impanelled examiners, it becomes very difficult to conduct the practical-cum-viva-voce examination, particularly in case of compartmental examination in which the no. of examinee remains too less.

It is worthwhile to mention here that B.V.Sc. & A.H. Programme is regulated through VCI-MSVE-2016. The provision in this regard as prescribed in MSVE 2016 are as follows: -

"The practical examinations shall be conducted by a Board of Examiners consisting of concerned Head of the Department, teacher(s) and a representative of the Dean."

Considering the facts, the clause 19 (12) of RRI of B.V.Sc. & A.H. Programme has been amended in anticipation of approval from the Academic Council duly notified vide O.O. No.- BASU/Reg./Exam./F.No. 195/239 (Memo No. 1000) dated 26.08.2025



The details of the amendment are as follows-

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal and pass appropriate decision.

- Further, it has been resolved that no remuneration will be admissible to the internal examiners/experts.

## 10/AC-23/25 Recognition of Fellowship of the National Academy of Veterinary Sciences (India) at par with other Academic Fellowships for assessment in Selection and Promotion.

The National Academic of Veterinary Sciences (NAVS) vide its letter dated <u>07.05.2025</u> requested to consider the Fellowship of the National Academy of Veterinary Sciences, India at par with other academic fellowships and ensure its appropriate weightage in interviews, selection and promotion.

The Dean, BVC, Patna vide its letter No. <u>235/BVC</u>, Patna dated 25.08.2025 submitted that in the existing BASU score card for selection and promotion, due weightages for fellowships from recognized national and international academies, professional societies, etc., has already been incorporated at different stages of assessment (AGP ₹6000 to ₹7000, AGP ₹8000, AGP ₹9000, and AGP ₹10000).

The matter is placed before the Academic Council for kind appraisal.

### Resolution:

After due discussion and deliberation, it has been resolved that weightage for fellowship of National academy, Professional Societies and other fellowship may be fixed as follows for selection and promotion in different stages of assessment of the teachers –

National Academies like NAVS/NAAS/NADS(I)/INSA — 4.00 marks
Professional Societies — 2.00 marks
Any other academic fellowship — 0.5 marks
and Score Card be revised accordingly.

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### 11/AC-23/25 Approval of guideline for Engagement of "Professor of Practice" at Bihar Animal Sciences University, Patna.

In accordance with UGC guidelines under the provisions of NEP-2020, the 3<sup>rd</sup> Board of Studies (BOS) of College of Veterinary and Animal Sciences, Kishanganj has proposed the guideline for engagement of "Professor of Practice" at Bihar Animal Sciences University, Patna, as detailed below-

### **Objective**

- 1. To develop courses and curriculum to meet the industry and societal needs and enable the HEIs to work with industry experts on joint research projects and consultancy services
- 2. To bring in distinguished experts from various fields into the academic institutions;
- 3. To enable the higher education institutions to formally associate with persons of eminence through experiential learning, research, training etc.

### **Eligibility:**

- 1. Distinguished experts who have made remarkable contributions in their professions
- 2. Those who have proven expertise in their specific profession or role with at least 15 years of service/experience, preferably at a senior level, will be eligible for "Professor of Practice"
- 3. These experts will also be exempted from the requirement of publications and other eligibility criteria stipulated for the recruitment of faculty members at the Professor level.

### **Duties and Responsibilities:**

- 1. Involve in the development and designing of course and curriculum.
- 2. To encourage students in innovation and entrepreneurship projects & provide necessary mentorship.
- 3. Carryout joint research project or consultancy services in collaboration

### **General Conditions:**

- 1. The engagement of PoP will be for a fixed term as per instruction of competent authority.
- 2. PoP will not open for either serving or retired teaching professionals.



### Categories or Engagement:

- 1. Following PoP will be engaged as per the norm fixed by competent authority.
  - a) Professor of practice funded by industries
  - b) Professor of practice funded by HEIs from their own resources
  - c) Professor of practice on honorary basis

PoP will share their expertise with students. "Professor of Practice" and their services will be utilized for the benefit of the students.

### Procedure for selecting Professor of Practice:

Deans/University HoD's will nominate form different disciplines along with willingness of the nominated person.

### Tenure:

The engagement will be initially for up to one year. The maximum duration of service of Professor of Practice will be for three years and is extendable by one year in exceptional case and the total service will not exceed four years under any circumstances.

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal and pass appropriate decision.

#### **Resolution:**

- Approved
- Professor of Practice (PoP) shall be over and above sanctioned faculty position as per UGC guidelines.
- Remuneration of Professor of Practice shall be @ 1000/- per lecture and ever maximum of Rs. 4000/- per day subject to maximum ceiling of Rs. 80,000/- per month on the same lines as for Adjunct Professor.
- TA/DA of Professor of Practice shall be admissible as per the admissibility of the Adjunct Professor. Free accommodation will be provided.

12/AC-23/25 Consideration of the application of Mr. Nishu Kumar, a first semester B. Tech. (Dairy Technology) student (2024 batch) to drop the second semester due to personal and unavoidable reasons, and to register in the forthcoming third semester.

Mr. Nishu Kumar, a first semester B. Tech. (Dairy Technology) student, has submitted an <u>application</u> to drop the second semester due to personal and unavoidable reasons, and to register in the forthcoming third semester.

There is no provision for dropping from the semester as per existing

regulations. The 13<sup>th</sup> BOS of SGIDT, Patna vide its agenda No. 13.2 considered the application of Mr. Nishu Kumar to temporarily allow to drop him from the second semester and allow to register in the forthcoming third semester as an special case. He will have to complete the second semester courses in the progressive semester as per existing rules and regulations of the university.

This recommendation is made to ensure academic continuity for the student while maintaining compliance with university regulations as a special case.

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal and pass appropriate decision.

### Resolution:

- Approved in line with recommendation of NEP-2020.
- Further it has been resolved that regular courses of 2<sup>nd</sup> semester shall not be allowed to be registered in subsequent regular semester (i.e. upto 8<sup>th</sup> regular semester). 2<sup>nd</sup> semester courses shall be allowed to be registered in the 9<sup>th</sup> semester.
- The student shall not be eligible for any medal or fellowship as per R.R.I.

### 13/AC-23/25

To allow the three students of B. Tech (Dairy Technology) 2024 Batch to register in the forthcoming third semester as a special case, who have been rusticated for the second semester due to disciplinary action.

Three students of B. Tech. (Dairy Technology) namely Mr. Priyanshu Raj, Roll No. SDT/07/2024, Mr. Aditya Kumar, Roll No. SDT/13/2024 and Mr. Vivek Kumar, Roll No. SDT/19/2024 were rusticated from institute for one semester (2<sup>nd</sup> semester, Batch 2024) vide O.O. No. 284/SGIDT, Patna dated 28.03.2025.

The 13<sup>th</sup> BOS of SGIDT, Patna vide its agenda No. 13.3 has recommended that these students be allowed to register for the forthcoming third semester as a special case. Later, when the second semester aligns with the academic calendar, they will be allowed to take the second semester courses.

This recommendation is made to ensure academic continuity for the students while maintaining compliance with university regulations as a special case.

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal and pass appropriate decision.

### Resolution:

- Approved
- 2<sup>nd</sup> semester courses shall not be allowed to be registered during 8 semesters of degree programme.
- It was also decided that these students shall not be entitled to receive any medal or fellowship as per R.R.I.
- No stipend shall be payable to these students.

### 14/AC-23/25 Modalities for admission against supernumerary seats of B.Tech. (D.T.) Programme.

Academic Council in its 21st meeting vide its agenda No. 15 resolved that-

- 1. In line with UGC guidelines, 25% (15 seats) seats are created under supernumerary seats for international students which are over and above the approved seats for Bihar domicile and national students in B.Tech. (D.T.) Programme
- 2. Modalities for admission against supernumerary seats shall be worked out at level of BOS, SGIDT, Patna and put up in the next Academic Council Meeting.

The aforesaid decision has already been notified vide N. No.BASU/Reg./Acad./F.No.-01(18)/52 (Memo No.-219) dated 10.05.2025.

The 13<sup>th</sup> Board of Studies of SGIDT, Patna vide its agenda No. 13.4 recommended that the admission modalities for these supernumerary seats shall be formulated at the university level so that they remain in sync with the university's overall admission process.

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal and pass appropriate decision.

Resolved to drop due to incomplete agenda. It shall be put up in the next meeting of the Academic Council with complete agenda and recommendation as per the decision made in this regard.

### 15/AC-23/25 To introduce a formal dress code for students enrolled in the B.Tech. (Dairy Technology) program, starting from the 2024 and 2025 Batches.

There is no provision for formal dress code for students of B. Tech.(DT).

The formal attire is intended to enhance the overall decorum of the academic environment and reflect the distinctiveness of the program.

In order to promote discipline, uniformity, and a sense of professional identity among students, the 13<sup>th</sup> Board of Studies of SGIDT, Patna vide its agenda No. 13.5 recommended the following formal dress code for implementation:

### For B.Tech. (Dairy Technology) Batch 2024:

- Male Students: White shirt, navy blue trouser, and black shoes.
- Female Students: White kurti, navy blue salwar, blue dupatta and black shoes.

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### For B.Tech. (Dairy Technology) Batch 2025:

- Male Students: Sky blue shirt, navy blue trouser and black shoes.
- Female Students: Sky blue kurti, navy blue salwar, blue dupatta and black shoes.

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal and pass appropriate decision.

#### Resolution:

- Approved in principle.
- Female students may also prefer shirt and trouser, if they wish so.
- Further, the students may also opt the dress as one piece or two piece as per their wish.
- To be applicable to all batches on rolls of college.
- Also to be replicated across colleges.
- Ph.D. and PG students shall use white Lab Coat besides any protective clothing at plant/clinics/farm/lab.

### 16/AC-23/25 Approval of modalities for admission under outside state quota seats of PG and Ph.D. programmes.

The 15<sup>th</sup> PG Board of Studies recommended the modalities for admission under outside state quota seats of PG and Ph.D. programmes vide its agenda No. 15.6, which are as follows-

### 1. Number of Seats for admission in master's/ PhD degree programme under other state quota

One seat in each department (in addition to exiting seats for the candidate of resident of Bihar and ICAR quota) shall be available for candidates from outside state of Bihar. No reservation will be applicable to candidates from other states. These candidates shall not be entitled for any state sponsored fellowship/ stipend.

### 2. Eligibility for Admission

### 2.1 Master's Degree Programme

The minimum academic attainment for admission to Master's Degree Programme of the University shall be as follows: -

- (i) A candidate should possess a basic degree U.G. i.e. B.V.Sc. & A.H. or B.F.Sc in the subject concerned.
- (ii) For getting admission to Master's programme, the merit will be determined on the basis of the criteria laid down by the P.G. Faculty and Academic Council subject to the following conditions:

- (a) A candidate should possess Bachelor's Degree in the subject concerned with minimum of 60% marks in aggregate or an OGPA of 6 out of 10 in a 10 point scale and 55% in aggregate or an OGPA of 5.5 out of 10 for SC/ST candidates.
- (b) Merit will be determined on the basis of rank/marks obtained in Entrance examination for M.V.Sc., M.Tech., M.F.Sc. and Ph.D. Admission test as mentioned in RRI of BASU.
- (c) A candidate selected for admission to Master's Degree Programme would be allowed to exercise option of discipline in the concerned stream in which he/she has appeared in the Entrance Examination.
- (d) A student admitted to the Post-graduate Programme may be required to take deficiency courses, if any, prescribed by the Chairman/HoD and Advisory Committee, in addition to the courses required as per regulation.

### 2.2 Ph.D. Degree

The minimum qualification for admission to the Ph.D. Programme shall be Masters' Degree in the subject concerned with at least 70% marks in aggregate or OGPA 7.0/10.0 at the Masters' level and is relax able of SC/ST up to 65% marks in aggregate or OPGA 6.5 out of 10.0 for candidates belonging to SC/ST categories.

### 3. Mode of Selection

A separate call of admission in Master's and PhD programme in different departments under other state quota shall be notified in the admission bulletin/ prospectus for admission in BASU, Patna. Merit list of the candidate for admission under this quota will be notified separately for candidates belonging to states other than Bihar.

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### 3.1 Master's Degree

Admission in Master's Degree Programme shall be made on the basis of competitive examination conducted either by the University or on the basis of merit of AIEEA (PG) Examination conducted by ICAR followed by counselling by the University.

### 3.2 Ph.D. Degree Programme

Admission in Ph.D. Degree Programme shall be made through merit/score of AICE (Ph.D.) Examination conducted by the University/ICAR followed by counselling by the University.

### 4. Admission of Students

### 4.1 Certificates required with application: -

- (i) Certificate of having passed the qualifying examination together with copy of the marks-sheet/transcript of all the examinations passed.
- (ii) Matriculation certificate as proof of age.
- (iii) Certificate of Character from the Head of the Institution last attended and also another one from a Gazetted Officer or a College or University teacher not related, but intimately known to the candidate.
- (iv) Certificate of Physical fitness from a Registered Medical Practitioner.
- (v) A Migration and/or Transfer Certificate in case of the candidate migrating from a University other than Bihar Animal Sciences University, Patna, Bihar.
- (vi) A college leaving certificate from the institution last attended.

### 5. Notification of Merit List for Selection under other state quota

Merit list of the candidates shall be notified on the notice board of the University by the Registrar/the Registrar will announce the date and time of counselling for admission in different post graduate programme, under other state quota, in consultation with DRI-cum-Dean PGS, BASU. A candidate who fails to report on the date and time as announced will lose the claim for admission. The University bears no responsibility in the event of non-receipt of information due to postal delays.



- **6.** Counselling of students for admission under other sate quota: Counselling shall be made as per RRI guidelines as for the other students.
- 7. The fee for admission in Master's and Ph.D. for outside state students will be Rs. 40,000.00 per semester.
- 8. Hostel facility will be provided as per university rule, if available.
- 9. Other facility will be provided as per university rule.

Note: All other general terms and condition shall remain the same, as for admission of general students, as described in RRI, BASU, Patna.

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal and pass appropriate decision.

- Fee shall be the same as prescribed for general student with additional tuition fee of Rs. 6,000/- in each semester.
- In 1<sup>st</sup> round, selection of the students shall be made on the basis of ICAR entrance examination.
- If the seats remain vacant after  $1^{st}$  round, the rest seats may be filled-up in  $2^{nd}$  round on the basis of %ge of marks obtained in qualifying degree from .

 Most of the leading international publishers, such as Elsevier, Springer Nature, Wiley, Taylor & Francis, Oxford University Press, Cambridge University Press, MDPI, Hindawi, and Frontiers, have largely transitioned to



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open access or gold open access publishing models, which require the payment of APCs to make research publicly accessible.

- While such journals offer broader visibility, higher citation potential, and strengthen global scientific communication, the financial implications often pose a barrier for PG students and faculty members.
- The provision of financial support will not only enhance the visibility of BASU's research but also contribute to improve NAAC/NIRF rankings, strengthen compliance with ICAR and open science mandates, and position the university as excellence in research in animal sciences.

The 15<sup>th</sup> PG BOS has <u>recommended</u> to introduce and approve a scheme for providing financial assistance towards Article Processing Charges (APCs) for faculty members of Bihar Animal Sciences University (BASU), Patna, to facilitate the publication of their research and project work in reputed, high-impact journals, if article will be published in the Journal which will be having the impact factor more than 2.5.

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal and pass appropriate decision.

Approval of guidelines for Admission process, Pursuing Ph.D and grant of study leave for In-service teaching faculty.

The 8<sup>th</sup> RIC has recommended as an agenda to the Academic Council for consideration and approval of the guidelines for Admission process, Pursuing Ph.D and grant of study leave for In-service teaching faculty as detailed below -

### 1. Admission process for In-Service candidate

A. One Sponsored (In-service) candidate from ICAR/CAU/ SAUs/BASU



may be admitted in the PhD in each discipline over and above the allocated seats.

- B. In general reservation policy has been already applied for filling of allocated seats of PG & PhD. However, further reservation may not be required for admission of the in-service candidate.
- C. Biannual Admission for In-Service Candidates: The admission process for in-service candidates may be conducted twice a year, alongside the regular admissions.
  - I. First intake purely on the basis of departmental common merit amongst the in-service candidate in the All India Entrance Examination conducted by the National Test Agency (NTA) ICAR.
  - II. Second intake may be through an entrance test conducted by Bihar Animal Sciences University (BASU).

### 2. Guidelines for pursuing Ph.D. for Teacher

The applicants should have completed a minimum of three years continuous service in the BASU. In general, study leave will not be insisted upon for in-service candidates as long as the Ph.D. work relates to an approved research project within University mandate.

- A. In cases where a teacher desires to do Ph.D. in an area where work cannot be done within an approved research project in the mandated area of the University, he may be permitted to do the Ph.D. degree by granting him study leave under existing BASU Study Leave Regulations. Such permission will be granted only in cases where it is possible to spare the teacher without detriment to the work of the University.
- B. The permission to do Ph.D degree within the University is again subject to the condition stipulated here under:
  - I. During the course work, including comprehensive examination, the teacher/scientist shall be granted study leave under existing BASU Study Leave Regulations with full pay and allowances for a period of three (3) semesters.
  - II. After completion of course work and passing the comprehensive examination, the teacher/scientist shall join back his/her duties and the research/dissertation work shall be done at Bihar



Animal Sciences University within a minimum of five (5) semesters. This period however, may be extended to a maximum of seven (7) semesters for research/dissertation work with permission of the Dean, Postgraduate Studies. Any further extension shall require the permission of the Vice-Chancellor of the University and he/she will be granted leave of the kind due or EOL as may be applicable. In addition to the research for dissertation, the teacher/scientist shall continue to perform normal academic duties in the department during this period. Inservice candidates may be allowed to register maximum of 9 credit hours per semester. This will enable them to effectively manage their ongoing teaching and other responsibilities along with their PG research.

- III. Admission procedure/allotment of Major Advisor/formation of advisory committee/course, comprehensive examination, progress of research work and dissertation evaluation etc. will remain the same as per the existing rules and regulations of the University. The teacher/scientist shall have to execute a bond to serve the University for a period of three years as per existing format. The bond period shall start immediately after submission of Ph.D. thesis.
- 3. Guidelines for grant of extension in joining time to candidates selected as Assistant professor cum Jr. scientist/Assistant Professor (Grade pay of Rs. 6000/- PB-3) by BASU to complete Ph.D.
  - I. The selected candidates should have completed their course work, passed the qualifying examination and completed a minimum of two years residency period at the respective CAU /SAU/DU/Institute before selection.
  - II. In case the period required for completion of Ph.D work is six months or less, the University may consider to grant extension of joining time.
  - III. If the period required for completion of Ph.D is more than six months: Candidates pursuing Ph.D at Deemed University of ICAR/SAU/CAU, the candidates after joining BASU may be allowed to carry out thesis work in BASU after completion of three years of continuous service, provided the ICAR/SAU/CAUs agrees to allow a teacher of the BASU to function as co-guide. Such candidates are required to furnish

a bond to serve the University/College/Unit for a continuous period of at least three years to be calculated from the date of completion of his/her PhD.

- IV. Bond may be exempted for in-service candidates of BASU, who are pursuing their Ph.D. programs within the university.
- V. The quality of thesis of such candidate may be regularly monitored by the Advisory committee to ensure that quality is not compromised.
- VI. If the ICAR/SAU/CAUs does not agree for a co-guide, such candidate may be allowed to avail the leave of kind due and EOL (maximum of one year for study purpose) to complete their PhD from the institution where they are enrolled. In case the candidate is under probation, the probation period may be extended accordingly.

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal and pass appropriate decision.

The award shall be named after the name of the sponsor/donor". Gold medal in the name of donor may be given in a particular Department/College as desired by the Donor. Under the sub clauses 6.4.1 to 6.4.9 different provisions regarding Donor and Name of Award, Nature of the Award, Purpose of Award, Administration of the award, Eligibility for the award, Procedure for the selection of Candidates, Presentation of the Award, Donation of the Amount and Operation of the Accounts for donors' gold medal are mentioned. However, there is need for the amendment. Accordingly, a committee was constituted to review the existing guidelines and regulations for the award of Gold Medals to Undergraduate and Postgraduate students of the University and to frame fresh guidelines in line with national best practices.

Hence, the new guidelines were discussed in 10<sup>th</sup> RIC meeting and recommended as an agenda to the Academic Council for its consideration. The proposed guidelines are as follows-

#### 3. Financial provisions:

- (i) No endowment of less than ₹10,00,000/-(Rupees Ten Lakh) shall be accepted for the institution of a Gold Medal.
- (ii) The entire endowment amount shall be treated as corpus. The annual interest accrued shall be utilized towards the cost of the Gold Medal.
- (iii) Separate accounts shall be maintained for each endowment and operated as per University financial rules.
- (iv) The accounts of such donations shall be maintained and audited separately, and utilization reports may be provided to the donor upon request.
- (v) The Endowment Fund shall remain distinct from the normal grants received by the University from government or other agencies.
- (vi) A Management Committee consisting of DRI-cum-Dean, PGs, Registrar and Finance Comptroller of the University shall oversee the management of the Endowment Fund.

#### 4. Award of gold medals:

- (i) Medals shall be named as per the donor's request (subject to approval of the Board of Management) and awarded annually at the Convocation, in accordance with the MoU and University regulations.
- (ii) The first Gold Medal shall be awarded only after accrual of one year's interest on the endowment, unless the donor provides additional funds to start the award immediately.
- (iii) In the event that no medal is awarded in a year, or if the annual interest exceeds the medal cost, the unutilized amount shall be added back to the corpus.



- likes to give best thesis/best students awarded. However, if the donor desires to give the award for a particular year only they may do so and pay the amount for that period only.
- (ii) The donor may donate the amount for awarding Gold Medal to the brilliant student. They may sponsor the Gold Medal by donating the amount for a particular year or for the number of years they desire to do so.

#### 6.4.9 Operation of the Accounts

The capital fund received from the Donor shall be deposited in the name of Bihar Animal Sciences University, Patna in any Nationalized Banks. Long Term Fixed Deposit with maximum available rate of interest. On maturity the fixed deposit shall be renewed by the bank.

- (i) This capital money shall be kept intact in the Bank and shall not be utilized in any event. The capital amount can be included by other sources without any claim for change in the name of award.
- (ii) The interest accruing from the capital fund shall be kept in a separate saving account of the bank in the name of Bihar Animal Sciences University, Patna. Cost of the Award shall be met out of the interest earned from the capital amount.
- (iii) The Accounts in the bank shall be operated and maintained as per rules of the University. A report will be sent to the Donor every year.

#### 5. Review and continuation of endowment:

- (i) If the available funds are insufficient, the University may negotiate with the donor to increase the endowment.
- (ii) If the donor declines to enhance the fund, the University reserves the right to cancel the endowment and forfeit the unspent amount. No interest shall be payable to the donor in such cases.
- (iii) Any change in the terms and conditions of the award may be made by the Board of Management, in consultation with the donor.

#### 6. Administrative Powers:

- The University may add or discontinue any Gold Medal/endowment as per the directions of the competent authority.
- (ii) The Vice-Chancellor of BASU, Patna may approve modifications to terms and conditions, in consultation with the donor.
- (iii) The Vice-Chancellor of BASU, Patna shall be the final authority in resolving all disputes or issues arising in connection with the award of Gold Medals.

### 7. General rules:

- (i) The gold medal be named as "..... (name provided by donor) Gold Medal".
- (ii) The gold medal will be awarded annually to the best M.V.Sc./M.Tech. M.Sc./M.F.Sc./ Doctoral thesis, as the case may be.
- (iii) All the students who complete their M.V.Sc./M.Tech./M.Sc./M.F.Sc./ Doctoral degree in normal duration of the concerned programme (not more than five and seven continuous semester without any break for PG and Ph.D. Programme respectively, to be counted form the date of registration up to the date of notification) will be considered for the selection of the best thesis.



- (iv) The thesis submitted by the students will be scrutinized by a committee constituted by the approval of the Vice Chancellor, BASU, Patna.
- (v) If two or more students secure the same highest aggregate marks, then all the highest scorer students will be given gold medals.

A proposal to establish the 3<sup>rd</sup> veterinary college of Bihar State at Sipaya, Gopalganj was submitted to Animal and Fisheries Resources Department, Govt. of Bihar, Patna vide University L. No. 163/VCS, BASU, Patna dated 21.08.2025.

The department vide its L. No. संचिका सं0–6A BASU(1)05/2024-4062 / पटना–15 dated 11.09.2025 drawn the attention to the provision prescribed under section 11(2)(xii) of BASU Act, 2016 concerning of the power and function of the Board, which states that-

"To consider and approve establishment of a new college or faculty, amalgamation of two or more colleges or faculties into a single college or faculty or abolition of a college or faculty or reconstitution of any of the existing faculties on the recommendation of the Academic Council."

Accordingly, it has been requested from the department to submit the proposal to establish the new veterinary college duly recommended by the Academic Council and approved by the Board of Management of the University.

The matter is placed before the Academic Council for kind consideration and appropriate decision.
